ORDINANCE NO. 2019-4

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF VALLEY-WIDE RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT, ESTABLISHING AND IMPLEMENTING DISTRICT BASED ELECTIONS (ELEC. CODE 10010, 10650)

WHEREAS, this Board of the Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District (the "Board") currently elects its members of the Board of Directors using an at-large method of election where candidates may reside in any part of the District and each member of the Board of Directors is elected by the voters of the entire District; and

WHEREAS, while the Board of Directors of the Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District strongly believes that the interests of all of the District's residents have been fully and fairly represented under the District's current at-large method of election, the Board of Directors nonetheless finds that moving to a by-district method of election is in the best interest of the District and its taxpayers because of the status of State law, and the significant litigation cost that could result if the District does not change its method of election; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of California Elections Code, a District that changes from an at-large Board of Directors method of election to a by-district Board of Directors method of election requires a total of five public hearing, which includes at least two public hearings regarding potential voting district boundaries prior to the release and consideration of any draft voting maps, two public hearings following the release of draft voting district map(s); and a fifth public hearing for the purpose of adopting an ordinance, that includes district maps, in order to transition to district voting; and

WHEREAS, at the regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District held on the December 17, 2018, the Directors adopted Resolution No. 1073-18 that initiated the process of establishing a district based election system and adopted the schedule therefore; and

WHEREAS, at the regular meetings of the Board of Directors of Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District held on June 17, 2019 and July 15, 2019, pursuant to California Elections Code Section 100109a)(1), the Board of Directors held public hearings where the public was invited to provide input regarding the composition of the District's voting districts before any draft maps were drawn, and the Board of Directors of Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District considered and discussed the same; and

WHEREAS, thereafter, at regular and adjourned regular meetings of the Board of Directors of the Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District held on October 21, 2019 and November 18, 2019 pursuant to California Elections Code Section 10010(a)(2), the Board of Directors held public hearings where the public was invited to provide input regarding the content of the draft maps that had been released at least seven (7) days before each meeting, and the Board of Directors of Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District considered and discussed the same; and

WHEREAS, at the regular adjourned meeting of the Board of Directors of Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District held on the 18 day of November 2019, after holding a public hearing on the proposal to establish district boundaries and reviewing additional public input, the Board of Directors of Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District introduced this Ordinance for a first reading which formally selects voting district map **Green Map**, attached hereto; directs that seats for Districts 2, 4 and 5 will be placed on the District's 2020 ballot; and directs that the seats for Districts 1 and 3 will be placed on the 2022 ballot; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Ordinance is to enact, pursuant to California Elections Code Sections 10010 and 10650, an Ordinance providing for the election of members of the Board of Directors of Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District by-district in five single-member districts as reflected in Exhibit A to this Ordinance, in furtherance of the purposes of the California Voting Rights Act of 2001 (Chapter 1.5 (commencing with Section 14025) of

Division 14 of the Elections Code) and to implement the guarantees of Section 7 Article 1 and of Section of Article II of the California Constitution.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of the Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN as follows:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
- Transition to District-Based Elections.

The District hereby finds that it will transition from at-large elections to district-based elections, beginning with its next regular election of the Board of Directors.

3. Establishment of Districts.

The District hereby establishes five Director Districts within the Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District. The boundaries and identifying number of each district shall be as depicted on the Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District 2019 map **Green**Map, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and which shall be maintained on file at the District's office.

4. Elections Process.

- A. Members of the Board of Directors shall be elected in the electoral districts established by this Ordinance and subsequently reapportioned as provided for by State Las and Section 7 of this Ordinance. Elections shall take place "by district", meaning that one Director shall be elected from each district by the voters of that district alone.
- B. No term of any member of the Board of Directors that commenced prior to the effective date of this Ordinance shall be affected by the adoption of this Ordinance.
- C. A Director elected or appointed to represent a district must reside in that district and be a registered voter in that district. Any candidates for the Board must reside in and be a registered voter in the district in which he or she seeks election at the time the nomination papers are issued.

- D. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, the Directors in office at the time this Ordinance takes effect shall continue in office until the expiration of the term for which he or she was elected. In the event a vacancy occurs before the expiration of the term of a Director in office at the time this Ordinance takes effect, a person who is appointed or elected by special election to fill such vacancy may reside anywhere in the district.
- E. The term of each Director elected to the Board of Directors shall remain four (4) years.

5. Implementation

The district-based election system shall be implemented, beginning at the next regular election of the Board of Directors, as follows:

- A. Members of the Board of Directors shall be elected in Districts 2, 4 and 5 beginning at the next regular election of the Board of Directors in 2020, and every four years thereafter; and
- B. Members of the Board of Directors shall be elected in District 1 and 2 beginning at the regular election of the Board of Directors held in 2022, and every four years thereafter.

6. Adjustment of Boundaries

Pursuant to Elections Code 22000. As may be amended from time to time, the Board of Directors shall adjust the boundaries of any or all of the districts following each decennial federal census to ensure the districts are in compliance with all applicable provisions of law.

7. If necessary to facilitate the implementation of this Ordinance as determined by the County Registrar of Voters, the Secretary is authorized to make technical adjustments to the district boundaries that do not substantively affect the populations in the districts, the eligibility of candidates, or the residence of elected officials within

any district. The Secretary shall consult with the General Manager and District Attorney concerning any technical adjustments deemed necessary and shall endeavor to provide the Board if Directors with 3 days advanced notice of any such adjustments required in the implementation of the districts.

- 8. In the event at any time in the future the California Voting Rights Act is amended, found to be unconstitutional, or otherwise is no longer applicable to the District, the Board of Directors expressly indicates its intention that the by-district election method be re-examined, and on behalf of itself and all future Board of Directors, expressly reserves its right to repeal or modify this Ordinance.
- 9. To the extent the terms and provisions of this Ordinance may be inconsistent or in conflict with the terms or conditions of any prior District Ordinance, motion, resolution, rule or regulation governing the same subject, the terms of this Ordinance shall prevail with respect to the subject matter thereof.
- 10. In interpreting this Ordinance or resolving an ambiguity, this Ordinance shall be interpreted in a manner that effectively accomplishes its stated purposes.
- 11. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, then such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. Menifee CONTACT OUR STAFF in Wheattield Park

Although the public hearing was closed, the Menifee City Council was hesitant at its Nov. 6 meeting to make a decision to approve or deny a proposed AT&T 70-foot high, \$1 million cell tower in Wheatfield Park.

Seeking more information about where the tower might be located other than the popular city park at 30627 Menifee Road, council members Lisa Sobeck and Matthew Liesemeyer said they could not make a decision on whether to uphold the city planning commission's recommendation to deny the conditional use permit or overrule and approve the project that evening.

AT&T made the request to build the tower in the park that is managed by Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District, saying it would fill a large gap in the mobile phone coverage for the city and the Mt. San Jacinto College Menifee campus. AT&T representatives at the meeting said other locations for the tower were considered, including one on the college campus itself, but ruled out. A tower atop Bell Mountain used by AT&T was not close enough to another tower south of the city to allow full mobile phone coverage, particularly from vehicles.

The Menifee planning commission reviewed the proposal, sought public comment on the cell tower and determined that while it complied with all city building regulations, Wheatfield Park may not be the safest and most aesthetic location for such a tall tower. The commission recommended the council's denial of the conditional use permit.

During the public hearing, called by the council that evening, seven residents made comments disapproving of the tower and one, as an AT&T customer, said it would be of great help. Those asking the council to uphold the planning commission's denial argued the tower would not look good in the public park, would encourage graffiti, endanger Bell Middle School students and other children who might want to climb up on it, hinder nearby residents line of sight to the annual fireworks show and the surrounding mountains and was not really needed because AT&T customers could still call on their mobile phones in the company's "gap" area.

The AT&T representatives said the tower is needed, particularly during high phone use during emergency situations, drivers using their phones in cars, the tower itself was designed to fit in well with the surrounding community homes and buildings, safety measures to keep off climbers are included and its design in compliance with all the city's building codes. The representatives said the tower itself is the Taj Mahal of cell towers and includes a working clock system. The representatives showed a video presentation of how it would look in the park.

The council expressed concern if their denial of the tower would conflict with U.S. government communication regulations it might result in an expensive lawsuit. Federal communication regulations can override any state or local regulations concerning wireless communication systems if the public's safety is of concern.

The Menifee city attorney said if the denial were made, it could result in a lawsuit brought by AT&T because of the federal regulations. The AT&T representatives said they could not comment on that possibility.

Sobeck asked if AT&T had other alternatives to fill their communication gap like smaller microwave boxes on existing utility poles. The AT&T representatives said it would be possible but would require

The other issue was the ownership and management of the park itself since it belongs to Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District. Councilmember Dean Deines asked the AT&T representatives if they were aware that there is a possibility the city could one day take ownership of the park and any tower at that time might have to be taken down. AT&T seeks to lease the space in the park from Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District, yet certain city building codes still apply to the property, which is the reason a conditional use permit is being sought by AT&T.

After almost an hour of discussion in the public hearing, the council made a motion to continue the decision and asked staff and the AT&T representatives to review its location and any other alternatives before the final decision is made. That decision could come at the Dec. 4 next regular council meeting.

The council heard a staff report about changes requested by the council in the city's subdivision and grading ordinances that essentially amends the original subdivision and grading ordinances made by Riverside County before cityhood and updates the regulations to comply with new state requirements.

The list of changes was presented by the staff and adopted by the council following a public hearing that brought forth no public speakers.

The council also reviewed and discussed proposed campaign contribution limits for a possible ordinance requested by the ethics subcommittee Liesemeyer and Sobek.

The state's Political Reform Act limits contributions to \$7,800 from any committee, other than a political party committee for the November 2020 election.


Local jurisdictions, like Menifee, may enact a campaign ordinance that provides for additional or different campaign requirements and contribution limitations for committees active exclusively in its jurisdiction as long as the provisions are stricter than those in the Political Reform Act. Any changes would have to be posted on the Fair Political Practices Commission website.

Sobek initially suggested a limit of \$2,800 per contributor, but the council as a whole, decided the state limit of \$7,800 per contributor would be best and to stay with what the state limitations might be in the future. The state, according to Sobek, can change the limits every odd year with the next change in 2022. All contributions, whatever the amount, by law, must be reported by candidates to the Fair Political Practices Commission and are made public.

City Council denies proposal for cell tower in Wheatfield http://www.menifee247.com/2019/12/city-council-denies-proposal-for-cell-tower-in-wheatfield.

The Menifee City Council on Wednesday voted 3-2 to deny the placement of an AT&T cell tower in Wheatfield Park.

This was the fourth city meeting to address the proposal, which calls for a 70-foot cell tower behind the community building in the middle of Wheatfield Park. The design calls for it to look like a clock tower. After two Planning Commission meetings in which the project was discussed and recommended for denial, the City Council considered AT&T's appeal in two meetings and reached the same decision.

The denial is not complete, however, until city staff returns a resolution of denial for final approval by the council at its Dec. 18 meeting. It is possible that discussions between city officials and AT&T representatives on an alternative site could be held in the interim, council members and staff acknowledged.

According to Alexis Dunlap, who once again represented AT&T at Wednesday night's meeting, no such alternative site exists.

Dunlap said she had gone back to AT&T engineers about the feasibility of an option suggested previously by council members to use a number of small cell sites -- typically placed on light poles -- instead of the Wheatfield tower, which is considered a macro cell site.

"It was determined by our radio frequency engineers that a macro tower is needed to close the coverage gap," Dunlap said. "We may have coverage in the area, but it is not what is considered reliable coverage. Some users inside a structure or running an in-home business will not have the necessary coverage. In addition, some users may be able to make calls, but not do things like use streaming services."

Dunlap repeated her previous statement that AT&T engineers determined there were only three viable options for a cell tower needed to improve coverage in the area. Two options -- Mt. San Jacinto College and Bell Mountain Middle School -- were eliminated when the land owners rejected the proposal. The owner of Wheatfield Park -- Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District -- agreed to lease property to AT&T for a cell tower there.

Council member Greg August recommended that the council deny the proposal and reconsider it in the future, when city officials expect the City of Menifee to win jurisdiction over all parks on the east side of the 215 Freeway -- including Wheatfield Park -- away from Valley-Wide. The City continues in legal efforts to achieve detachment from Valley-Wide.

August pointed out that in the current environment, Valley-Wide would receive all the lease payments and the City would receive nothing.

"Who's the beneficiary? Valley-Wide, not the City," August said. "The reason I will vote to deny is that we're the regulators but they're the property owner. It would be in our best interests to wait until our jurisdiction is approved. If we approve this now, there's a good chance some of the money paid to Valley-Wide would be spent outside our city."

Valley-Wide owns and operates parks and supervises recreation services in Hemet, San Jacinto, French Valley and Winchester, in addition to parks on the east side of the 215 Freeway in Menifee.

Another concern was raised by council members Dean Deines and Lesa Sobek about what they believe is a possible cell tower site just west of the freeway that has not been given proper consideration by AT&T officials. AT&T's coverage ring for this area extends westbound past the freeway to vacant land there.

Dunlap said AT&T did not receive "a viable response" from that property owner.

"Our normal procedure is to send a certified letter to the property owner," Dunlap said. "If they don't respond to a certified letter within 30 days, we determine they are not interested. We do not have a willing landlord there."

Deines asked Dunlap whether she felt AT&T had made every effort to contact that land owner for a response.

"Your definition of a willing landlord is different than mine," he said. I would hope that AT&T would've taken an extra step to look at the other side of the freeway."

Part of AT&T's argument was that improved cell phone coverage in that area is needed to ensure sufficient communication in case of a national emergency. Local police and fire officials could not provide data to support or disprove that argument, however.

"If we predicate everything on the possibility of a national emergency, why don't we double police and fire coverage?" August asked.

Mayor Bill Zimmerman expressed concern over the possibility of a lawsuit filed by AT&T, and whether the ruling of a judge in AT&T's favor would be not only costly, but might compromise the conditions the City had placed in the initial proposal regarding the tower's design, etc.

"You're automatically assuming AT&T is gong to file a lawsuit," August responded. "The way to handle this is to vote for denial and then sit down with AT&T and try to find an alternative."

Ultimately, August made a motion to deny the project and Sobek seconded the motion. That motion passed 3-2, with Zimmerman and Deines voting against it.

Council members also took note of objections from several residents in past Planning Commission and City Council meetings about the wisdom of putting a cell tower in a public park, amid ballfields often used by youth.

"City staff has two weeks to draft the denial resolution, so you can continue to talk in the meantime," city attorney Jeffrey Melching said.


