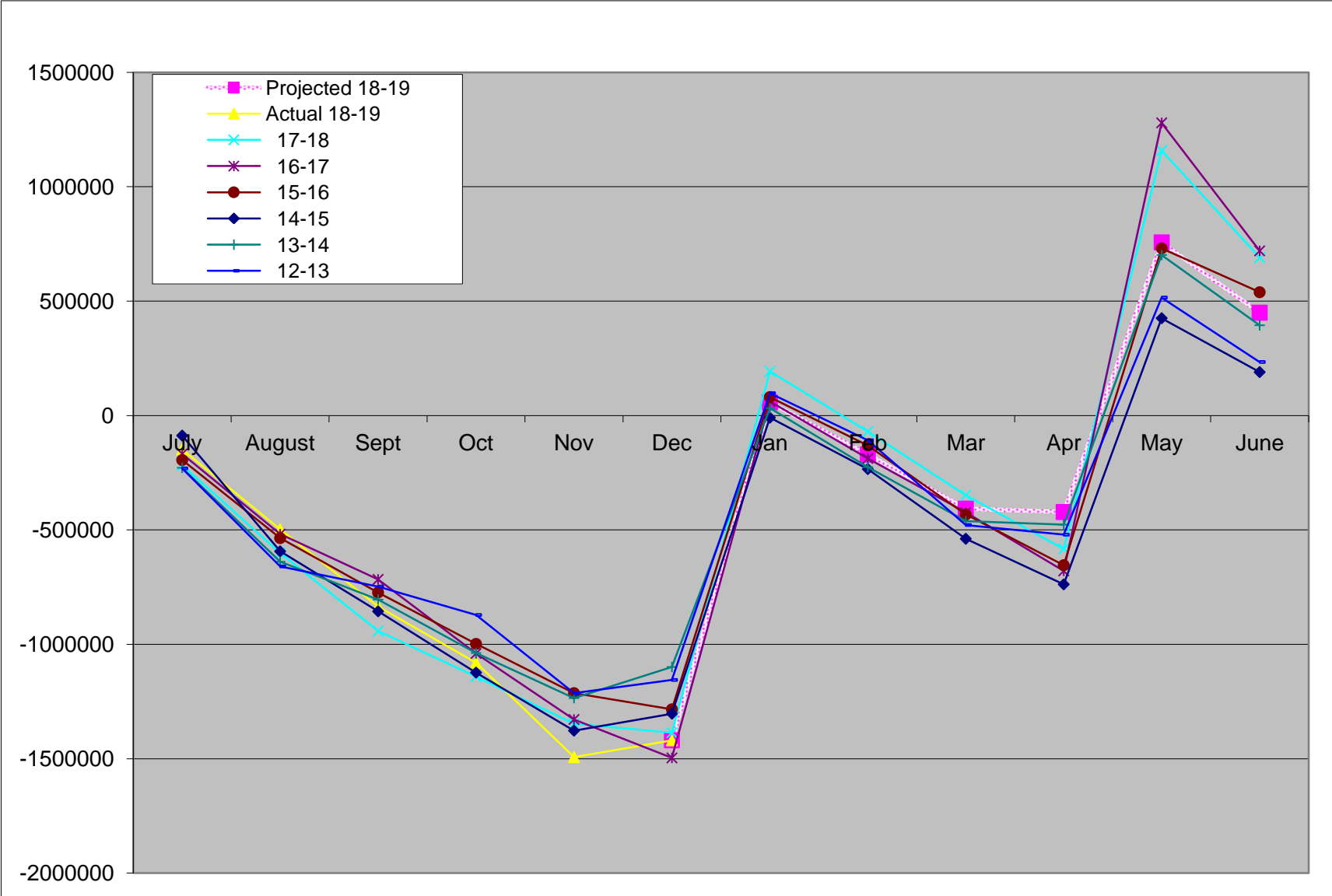

POLICY AND PROCEDURES MANUAL

POLICY TITLE: Board Meetings

POLICY NUMBER: 5010

Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held on the third Monday of each calendar month at 5:30 P.M. in the Board Room of the Administrative Offices at 901 W. Esplanade in San Jacinto. The date, time and place of regular Board meetings shall be reconsidered annually at the annual organizational meeting of the Board. The location, date and time of regular meetings, in addition to being “reconsidered” annually, can be changed, either annually, or from time to time by a majority vote of the Board.

Special meetings (non-emergency) of the Board of Directors may be called by the Board President.

All Directors, the General Manager, and [other desired staff] shall be notified of the special Board meeting and the purpose or purposes for which it is called. Said-notification shall be in writing, delivered to them at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the meeting. Written notice can include fax or e-mail delivery.

Newspapers of general circulation in the District, radio stations and television stations, organizations, and property owners who have requested notice of special meetings in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act (California Government Code 54950 through 554926) shall be notified by fax unless the special meeting is called less than one week in advance, in which case notice, including business to be transacted, will be given 72 hours notice.

An agenda shall be prepared as specified for regular Board meetings in Policy #5020 and shall be delivered with the notice of the special meeting to those specified above.

Only those items of business listed in the call for the special meeting shall be considered by the Board at any special meeting.

Special Meetings (emergency). In the event of an emergency situation involving matters upon which prompt action is necessary due to the disruption or threatened disruption of public facilities, the Board of Directors may hold an emergency special meeting without complying with the twenty-four (24) hour notice required above. An emergency situation is defined as a work stoppage, crippling activity, or other activity that severely impairs public health, safety, or both as determined by a majority of the members of the Board of Directors.

Newspapers of general circulation in the District, radio stations and television stations which have requested notice of special meetings in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act (California Government Code 554950 through 54926) shall be notified by at least one (1) hour

prior to the emergency special meeting. In the event that telephone services are not functioning, the notice requirement of one hour is waived, but the General Manager, or his/her designee, shall notify such newspapers, radio stations, or television stations of the fact of the holding of the emergency special meeting, the purpose of the meeting and of any action taken by the Board, as soon after the meeting as possible.

In a dire emergency, defined as a crippling disaster, mass destruction, terrorists act, or threatened terrorist activity that poses peril so immediate and significant that requiring the Board of Directors to provide one-hour notice before holding an emergency meeting may endanger the public health, safety, or both as determined by a majority of the members of the Board of Directors, the press shall be notified at or near the time that the President or designee notifies the Board Members of the meeting.

A closed session meeting may be held during emergency and dire emergency special meetings with a 2/3 vote or a unanimous vote if less than 2/3 of the Board Members are present. All other rules governing special meetings shall be observed with the exception of the twenty-four (24) hour notice. The minutes of the emergency special meeting, a list of persons the General Manager or designee notified or attempted to notify, a copy of the roll call vote(s), and any actions taken at such meeting shall be posted for a minimum of ten (10) days in the District office as soon after the meeting as possible.

Adjourned Meetings. A majority vote by the Board of Directors may terminate any Board meeting including special meetings at any place in the agenda to any time and place specified in the order of adjournment, except that if no Directors are present at any regular or adjourned regular meeting, the General Manager may declare the meeting adjourned to a stated time and place, and he/she shall cause a written notice of adjournment to be given to those specified above.

Annual Organizational Meeting. The Board of Directors shall hold an annual organizational meeting at its regular meeting in December. At this meeting the Board will elect a President, Vice President, and Secretary from among its members and will appoint the General Manager as the Boards' Treasurer. The Board of Directors will commence their office seats once the election of officers is complete.

The Chairperson of the meetings described herein shall determine the order in which agenda items shall be considered for discussion and/or action by the Board.

The Chairperson and the General Manager shall insure that appropriate information is available for the audience at meetings of the Board of Directors, and that physical facilities for said meetings are functional and appropriate.

- Award bid to Plant’s Choice, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder, for the Replacement of Playground Chips for Various Park Locations project, and waive any and all minor irregularities in the bidding document as submitted by said bidder;
- Authorize the General Manager to execute the Construction Agreement and Purchase Order between Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District and Plant’s Choice, Inc., in the amount of \$202,500.00; and
- Authorize the General Manager to approve appropriate Change Order(s) necessary for the execution of the work, in accordance with the signature authorization policy

ANALYSIS:

At its regular meeting of August 15, 2016, the Board of Directors awarded an informal bid to the lowest responsible bidder for replacement of playground chips, supplying a minimum of 2,300 cubic yards (CY) of premium quality playground chips. The contract was also used for annual upkeep and replacement of wood chips of all Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District playgrounds on an as-needed basis.

This 2016 contract has expired and District staff wishes to engage the services of a contractor under the same terms, whereas the contractor is to supply an initial 3,400 CY of premium playground chips and an additional 2,000 CY used for annual upkeep and replacement.

The contractor is to provide all labor, equipment and materials necessary to furnish and install engineered playground chips in designated play areas. Work to be performed consists of materials being spread in a smooth even layer throughout each play area. Play entrances and ADA access areas shall be raked



so that top of fiber is flush with adjacent access surface to create a smooth and even transition between the hard surface and wool fiber.

The District advertised the project Public Notice Inviting Bids on December 18, 2018, setting a bid date of January 17, 2019. The following chart represents the one bid received.

The licenses and references for Plant's Choice, Inc. have been reviewed and verified by staff, and all other documentation is in order. District staff will perform and/or coordinate the project management and inspection services.

Additionally, the surfacing under and around playground equipment is one of the most important factors in reducing the likelihood of injuries; therefore, regular mulch and playground chip maintenance is essential to the safety of the users.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The total construction cost for this project is estimated at \$202,500.00 and funded through individual park funding sources.

ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS:

This action is Categorically Exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requirements.

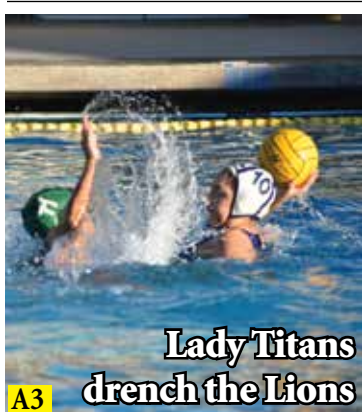

Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District moves toward by-district elections

HEMET – The Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District has taken the first steps toward changing how its board of directors is elected. The board voted 4-0 Monday, Dec. 17, with one member absent, to begin the process to transition to by-district elections.

Currently, the five members are elected at-large and may reside anywhere in the district, which includes the cities of Hemet and San Jacinto, parts of Menifee and the unincorporated communities of French Valley, Sage, Valle Vista and Winchester. There are an estimated 250,000 registered voters living within the district.

The plan is to have the change in place in time for the 2020 election, when the terms of Directors John Bragg, Steve Simpson and Noah Rau will expire.

The park district will hire a demographer to provide a variety of maps based upon permissible criteria. Before districts are set, there will be a number of community workshops to allow residents to provide input. The switch will ensure that Valley-Wide is compliant with the California Voting Rights Act.

In other business during its monthly meeting, the board of directors selected its leaders for the next year. Nick Schouten will be the board president, John Bragg will remain vice president and Jan Bissell will be secretary. Schouten and Bissell were sworn-in for new four-year terms Thursday, Dec. 20.

The directors also approved a \$2,033,750 contract with Adame Construction to build Jim Venable Exchange Club Park on the southwest corner of Mayberry and Fairview avenues in the Valle Vista community, east of Hemet. The park, which has been in the planning stage for more than a decade, will include basketball, pickleball and tennis courts and a picnic area.

San Jacinto City Council welcomed a new member to its dais, praised a retiring city councilman and announced the addition of a new canine police officer to the city police department in its Tuesday, Dec. 18, regular meeting.

Council chambers at the San Jacinto Community Center was filled with council family members and others who witnessed the swearing in of new council member Joel Lopez who is replacing retiring council member and former Mayor Scott Miller. Veteran councilman Alonso Ledezma took the oath of office for another four years after winning his third election to the seat.

Much of the meeting was taken up by presentations made to Miller, who spent his last eight years on the council and is stepping down. Honoring Miller were representatives from state Sen. Mike Morrell, Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District and the council who presented him with a gavel on a plaque to commemorate his time as the city's mayor. A 10-minute break brought him many handshakes and deserved pats on the back for the years of service he spent serving the city.

In his farewell, Miller praised his late wife who died while he was in office, her encouragement and the councilmembers he had worked with during his eight years.

Lopez and Ledezma pledged their service and support to the city for the next four years as the city continues its rapid commercial and industrial growth.

Following the break, the council voted to bring in Councilman Russ Utz as it newest mayor and Councilman Andrew Kotyuk was named mayor pro tem for the next year. Former Mayor Crystal Ruiz was praised for her past year's service as mayor and for the work she did to bring the city into the national spotlight with several visits to the White House on President Donald Trump's invitation. She will be returning to Washington, as a representative for the city and for the Southern California region in January.

In other business, the council welcomed Sgt. Mark Wallace from the Riverside County Sheriff's office who will be handling the city's new K9 officer Marco. Officer Marco, a 4-year-old Belgian malinois, is highly trained in everything from criminal apprehension to sniffing out explosives. He replaces San Jacinto Police K9 officer Wyatt who died unexpectedly Nov. 10, after three years of faithful service to the community.

K9 Marco and Sgt. Wallace will come aboard with the San Jacinto police department in February after academy training.

Russ Utz named mayor as Joel Lopez takes seat on city council

The leadership of San Jacinto changed last week as one city councilman stepped down, another newly elected citizen stepped forward to replace him, and the council named a new mayor.

Joel Lopez represents a new face on the San Jacinto City Council after being elected to fill the vacancy created by Mayor Pro Tem and former-Mayor Scott Miller, who stepped down after nearly 10 years of service to the city.

Lopez and Councilman Alonso Ledezma, who was returned to office for another term, com-

plete the five-person council. Other members include newly elected (by the council) Mayor Russ Utz, newly elected Mayor

Pro Tem Andrew Kotyuk, and now former-Mayor Crystal Ruiz.

Miller, who last fall was

urged by Ruiz to continue his work on behalf of the city, decided regardless to step down after nearly a decade of public service. The decision followed the death last May of his wife, Linda, his partner of 31 years. Miller was given no fewer than three awards at the city council meeting last Tuesday, Dec. 18, including a plaque from the city, one from the Valley-Wide Recreation District, and another from Heather Perry, a representative of State Sen. Mike Morrell, R-Dist. 23, in recognition of Miller's years of selfless and effective leadership.

Also receiving a plaque was Councilperson Crystal Ruiz

who, for the past year, has served as one of the city's most dynamic mayors in recent memory. Ruiz achieved recognition for creating a pro-business environment in the city that has led to numerous new businesses coming to town, including Starbucks and Aldi, and making inroads with the Trump

Administration in Washington D.C. that may lead to big dividends for the city down the road.

Four other candidates ran unsuccessfully for election to the council last fall, Steve DiMemmo, Mike Van Der Linden, Brian Reaser, and Jeremy Fontes.

Lopez, whom many considered a longshot in his bid for a seat on the council, is a local

businessman who owns Discount Battery Center on S. State Street in San Jacinto. He received a certain notoriety before the election when he rounded up several crews of homeless people and put them to work (at his own expense) cleaning up trash along major arteries throughout the San Jacinto business district.

Lopez took the oath of office Tuesday as his wife, Sabrina, and three children looked on from the audience. The event drew smiles from other members of the council, many of whom have been involved with city politics for years, seeing a newcomer with little if any background in public service be elected by the citizenry to one of the most important positions in the city. Lopez' can-do attitude and practical approach to problem solving may have appealed to voters tired of regulations and endless legal and political hurdles typically involved in getting things done.


